Visit to London – £20.00 per child

Class 4MR – Friday 8th June 2018 / Class 4KC – Friday 15th June 2018

As you are aware, your child along with their Year Four teachers, have invested significant time and efforts during the previous term on their Primary Enterprise Craft Project. We believe that the children develop many skills by undertaking such projects, whilst hopefully having lots of fun too.

Whilst having had lots of fun, the most important idea of any enterprise project is to make a profit, which your children certainly did, along with your help! Thank you. Along with support from the school's PTA and the profits made from the Primary Enterprise Craft Project, we are able to offer your children an extraordinary opportunity to visit London.

This will be the 9th year that a group of children from Swanland School have been on this visit and for Year 4 this will be their 6th visit. We cannot put into words how exciting an opportunity this is for your child! Having been on all of these visits, we never cease to be amazed at how much your children gain from having such an experience. They get to travel to and from London on the train, use the tube, visit the Houses of Parliament and see many of the famous landmarks and buildings of our capital city.

We are therefore pleased to be able to share with you some initial details about the plans for our visit with your children. **Class 4MR** will visit on **Friday 8th June**. **Class 4KC** will visit on **Friday 15th June**.

The children will be travelling to London by train from Brough Station. The train times will be confirmed once tickets have been booked. On the day of the trip the children will be required:

- to wear school uniform as usual;
- to wear sensible, comfortable, clean black school shoes;
- to wear a warm waterproof coat with hood or hat;
- to take a packed lunch and packed tea, including snacks for mid-morning and afternoon;
- to take plenty of drinks (no glass bottles or fizzy drinks please).
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Children will be put into small groups of 5 or 6 per adult and will be closely supervised at all times. The children will be issued with high-visibility vests to wear over their coats.

You will not be surprised to know that to organise a visit such as this will cost in the region of £50 per child. However, as we have already mentioned, with the support of the PTA along with the profits from the Primary Enterprise Craft Project, we are able to heavily subsidise this, enabling us to only have to ask for a **voluntary contribution of £20.00 per child**. We hope that this will enable all children to be able to participate in this wonderful opportunity.


