Class 3 – Visit to Street Life Museum and the Museum Quarter – Friday 1<sup>st</sup> March

On Friday 1<sup>st</sup> March the children in Class 3 will be visiting the above museums in Hull as part of this term's 'Electricity' topic. The coach will leave school at approximately 9.15 am and we will return by 3.30 pm, so you may collect your child from school as usual.

A packed lunch and a drink of water are required (no glass bottles please). Would you please pack your child's lunch in a disposable bag so this can be thrown away afterwards. As we will be walking between museums can you also please provide your child with a suitable coat, thank you. A contribution of £9.00 per child to help cover the cost would be gratefully received.

The above cost includes, return coach travel, a workshop and a two-hour 'LED' session.

- Workshop The children will:
  - Investigate how electricity was used in the past, by exploring Victorian transport
  - Understand where electricity comes from
  - Explore science in real life contexts
  - Understand the dangers of electricity
  - Understand the principles of a working circuit and apply this knowledge in a practical activity
  
- A two-hour session, led by Heritage Learning experts, named 'Shocking Science', which will include:
  - An introduction to the museum
  - An interactive gallery session with a Victorian character looking at the museum transport
  - An electricity themed science show

This visit is now available on the ParentPay website for you to pay online in the usual way. As you are now able to give consent on ParentPay you no longer need to return a
