Friday 14th July Classes 1 and 2 trip to Hornsea

Dear Parents and Carers

This term Classes 1 and 2 have been learning all about the seaside and for this reason we have planned a trip to the beach at Hornsea, whilst also including a visit to Beach Cove at Hornsea Freeport.

Beachcove:

“The new indoor and outdoor adventure play experience that will bring the seaside right into the Centre is now open!

We've got loads for you to see and do! The indoor play area known as 'The Caves' has been refurbished and is ready for you all to enjoy, don't worry though adults can enjoy food and drink in the brand new 'Rockpool Cafe'!

Outside we have a whole host of treats for you, which includes an outdoor adventure playground featuring a zip wire, bouncing pillow, giant sand pit and an electric car racing track! “

A fun day is planned:

- 10.00 – Arrive at Beach Cove
- 12.00 – Lunch
- 1.00 – Sandcastle Competition on the beach then ice cream
- 2.15 – Leave for home
- 3.00 – Arrive back at school

The children will need to wear their school sweatshirts with clothes of their choice. They will also need a waterproof coat, sunhat, sun cream applied, a packed lunch (in a plastic bag that can be thrown away) and 2 drinks (plastic bottles). Could you also please send your child with a named bucket & spade.

Classes 1 and 2 have raised funds, through their efforts at the Summer Fair, in order to reduce the cost of the trip which will be £3. This includes the cost of the coach and entry into Beach Cove. We would like the children to bring a further £2.00 cash on the day, for an ice cream and the amusements.

This visit is now available on the ParentPay website for you to pay online in the usual way. As you are now able to give consent on ParentPay you no longer need to return a paper permission slip to school. Should you require a paper permission slip, please contact the school office.
