Dear Parents and Carers

For transparency, I am writing to inform you that we have received confirmation that a member of our school community, who is a member of your child's class, Class 4, has received a positive PCR test result for COVID-19.

Following government and local authority guidance the affected person has now started their isolation. At present, there is no need for self-isolation of any of our children or staff other than the individual who has tested positive.

I would like to reassure you that our school is very careful to make sure everyone follows government and local authority guidance for COVID-19 prevention measures

Should any member of your household start to get symptoms of COVID-19 or return a positive result from a rapid asymptomatic test (LFT test) please self-isolate, arrange a confirmatory PCR test within two days and inform the school immediately.

The main symptoms of COVID-19 include:

- **a high temperature** – this means they may feel hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to take their temperature with a thermometer)
- **a new, continuous cough** – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if they usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- **a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste** – this means they may tell you that they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different.


